1. Key daily reading:

2. Complaining and Commending:

Print media

There are two ways of responding to articles you read in the press (a) by writing a letter to the journalist concerned (b) by writing a letter addressed to the editor for the paper's readers' letters page.

You can also write to the **Press Complaints Commission** if you feel an article has breached the Editors' Code of Practice. Although the PCC is soon to be defunct and a transitional body set up to oversee self-regulation until the Leveson Inquiry presents its recommendations, letters concerning breaches of the Editors' Code of Practice should be addressed to the PCC.
